





HOW CAN USERS FIND JOURNALS CONTENT ON THE SITE?




- 1 Search across journals and books from the Oxford Academic homepage at academic.oup.com;
- 2 Browse across a multi-layered subject taxonomy; or
- 3 Click into the journals homepage.

From the journals homepage, you can also:

- 1 Run a search;
- 2 Browse between Arts & Humanities, Law, Medicine & Health, Science & Maths, and Social Sciences; or
- 3 Browse by journal title.




WORKING WITH SEARCH RESULTS



- 1 Results are sorted by relevance by default.
- 2 Each result has an availability marker and is labelled as journal, journal article, image, etc.
- 3 Search modifications may be made using the left-hand panel. The search term may be edited, additional filters may be applied, and the search may be narrowed by format, article type, subject, journal, publication date, and availability.


NAVIGATING AN ARTICLE

- 1 Clicking into the content will show the journal or article, with options to download as a PDF, split screen, view citation and permissions information, and share.
- 2 Split view provides two independently scrolling panels: the left for the primary text, and the right to easily switch between contents, figures and tables, references, comments, and related material.
- 3 Within figures and tables, options are available to open the image in a new tab or download as a PowerPoint slide.



NAVIGATING JOURNALS PAGES

- 1 Search for articles within the journal.
- 2 See issues, subjects, submission options, and more. Society affiliation can be viewed and alerts can be set up through the **About** tab.
- 3 Easily view impact factor details.
- 4 Scroll down to see the latest, most read, or most cited articles, and Twitter feed.
- 5 Browse related journals.

NAVIGATING INFORMATION PAGES

Clicking the (i) icon opens the full menu of information pages. Of note for librarians and users:

- 1 **Institutional account management:** Guidance on how to manage preferences and obtain usage statistics and promotional materials;
- 2 **Get help with access:** Explains available access options; and
- 3 **Using the content:** Overview of the platform's core functionality and features.
